Face-to-Face Visits Day of the Visit - Guidance

This document is guidance for things to think about <u>on the day of your visit</u> to a family. It doesn't need to be uploaded or casenoted. It is to support you to think about what and how to prepare on the day you visit a family to help keep you and the family as safe as possible during COVID as we return to face-to-face work.

This list is not exhaustive, and you will need to make judgements with your line manager about managing risk depending on the unique circumstances of each family.

 Waste Bags to dispose of rubbish/disposable items if I and anyone in the family both touch them (follow public health guidance on waste disposal here https://ascpractice.camden.gov.uk/early-help-guide/family-early-help-covid-guidebook/fscf-procedures-during-covid/face-to-face-and-home-visits-guidance/#mainandincludes): 	
 Place in a bag, then place that bag into another bag, Tie securely and keep separate from other waste. The bag should be put aside for at least 72 hours before being put in the usual household waste bin for disposal. 	
 Pack of sanitiser wipes to clean any surfaces I touch in the home/venue and to clean my car steering wheel, keys and handles (if personal vehicle or bike being used) 	
 Any toys or resources I am taking are made of paper or plastic (no soft toys) and have been cleaned with sanitiser 	



 Sealable bags to put any pens or books I use in after the visit (felt tip pens should be thoroughly washed after the visit, and books should be kept in the bag for 72 hours before reusing – see also post-visit guidance here):
