

## Face-to-Face Visits Post- Visit Guidance

20 July 2020 – FINAL VERSION

This document is guidance for things to think after your face-to-face visit with a family. It doesn't need to be uploaded or casenoted. It is to support you to think about things to do after you have finished your visit to help keep you and the family as safe as possible during COVID as we return to face-to-face work.

This list is not exhaustive, and you will need to make judgements with your line manager about managing risk depending on the unique circumstances of each family.

I have washed my hands or used hand sanitiser since leaving the home/venue	
I have cleaned my car steering wheel, keys and handles with a sanitiser wipe since leaving the home/venue (if personal vehicle or bike being used)	
I have cleaned any toys or resources I used during the visit with santiser or soap	
I have put any books I used during the visit in a sealable bag and won't re-use them for another 72 hours	
If the toys, resources or books I used are shared with others in the team (e.g. I got them from our cupboards at 5PS), I will make sure to follow the above procedures before putting them back in the cupboard.	
If there were any signs of COVID symptoms in the home/venue that were not reported to me during the pre-visit checklist, I followed the lone-working procedure on COVID risks, reported the symptoms to my line manager and returned to my home immediately where I can shower/wash, and change my clothes/wash my clothes.
