Good morning to you all, I hope you and your families are doing okay.

You will no doubt be aware that London was added to the national COVID watch list on Friday. At this point, there are no additional restriction measures being put in place, but we will monitor this carefully this week. I am in regular contact with Public Health, and I will make sure I pass you any information as soon as I get it. A whole service meeting will be called if any changes are needed to our current working arrangements. Stay vigilant, and continue to tightly follow our procedures and the Governments social distancing guidance to help keep each other and families safe and well.

There was a request in last week's survey for some webinars on supporting asylum seeking families during COVID, period poverty and safety planning during COVID. Just to say I will make sure I factor those topics into the autumn webinar programme and watch this space.

Black History Month

This give us a platform to actively participate in raising the profile of black history that too often gets whitewashed. Camden's Budget and COVID

You will be aware that Camden, like all other local authorities, is facing financial pressures this year as a result of COVID. You can read about this on Essentials here https://lbcamden.sharepoint.com/sites/intranet/communications/Pages/financial-impact-of-Covid-19-latest-update.aspx. Camden's is now taking steps to try and reduce that pressure. This includes a vacancy freeze.

This means that any recruitment deemed to be essential must have authorisation from Martin's Directorate Management Team. It also means I have been told how much money the Council needs me to save from my salary budget by not recruiting to vacancies over the next 6 months.

Your service managers and I are now looking at our FSCF vacancies to decide what to do next, and particularly thinking about what the risks are if we don't fill those vacancies. I am sharing this with you so you know what is happening and why, and I'll make sure I keep you fully updated over the coming weeks. Please do get in touch if you have guestions about this.

Furlough Scheme and Eviction Ban Due to End

A reminder that the government furlough scheme (which protected jobs during COVID) and the temporary freeze on evictions (which particularly protected private tenants from being evicted during COVID) are both due to end very soon. Although the Chancellor has announced a new package of support for employees and self employed, there is still likely to be significant impact on parents in terms of jobs, debt, income and housing. As we've mentioned in previous bulletins, there are lots of organisations available to support families, but they are getting incredibly busy.

If you are working with a family that is likely to be affected by either the end of the furlough scheme or the eviction ban ending, <u>please do connect families to advice services as soon</u> as you can.
