Good morning to you

The announcement of an approved COVID vaccination last week will bring both relief and perhaps a slight apprehension for all of us and the families we help. The North London NHS system is now gearing up to undertake the enormous and complex job of managing how the vaccine rolls out. The first vaccinations are already in London.

Whilst we now know who will get the vaccine first, please be assured that conversations are already happening about vaccinations for frontline workers who are not health or social care registered, but do work with vulnerable people in their homes. As soon as I get information, I will let you know.

Immigration Status, NRPF and Support for People Seeking Asylum

Emergency Fuel Vouchers (Green Doctors)

Emergency fuel vouchers have been made available through Groundwork, funded the Energy Redress Fund, called the Green Doctors scheme. The vouchers are worth £30 each and are available to residents who have prepayment meters and are struggling to find money to top them up.

It describes the COVID crisis not as a sprint or a marathon but a 'thru-hike' (this means walking a long-distance trail with continuous
