

COVID Email Update 4 January 2021 (Dyslexia Friendly Version)

A very happy new year to you all, I hope you and your families had some rest over the holidays.

We start 2021 in Tier 4 along with a growing number of the UK population. Secondary schools return to on-site learning is delayed to give more time to get onsite COVID testing of students in place, an enormous task for Camden's 10 secondary schools, 6th form colleges and CCFL. Camden primary schools, along with primaries across London and other parts of the country, are also closed for onsite learning. Many of us are once again juggling home learning, childcare and work. If this (very last minute) change is affecting you and your family, please do reach out to your line manager for help and support.

I was going to open today with reflecting on things I'm looking forward to in the next 3 months. But given we've all had another chaotic and often worrying few days, I'll start 2021 with a focus on hope. How important our ability to hold hope will be, for the families we help, for our service and for ourselves. To hold as true both the awful reality of COVID and, to quote Barack Obama, the possibility that something better awaits us if we can find the courage to reach for it.

In 2020, every part of the service made a difference to the life of a child. I don't pretend for one second that it was easy. But you did it. Let's see what we can do together in 2021, one step at a time, one day at a time, and holding hope as much as we can.


Updates for you this week:

Information on Return To School

On 30 December, the Government announced changes to the dates when children will physically return to school for on-site learning. There is a summary below.

Camden primary schools now remain closed for onsite learning, along with Camden secondary schools. There is currently no confirmed date for on-site learning to resume, but DFE have said they will review it on 13 January. Secondary schools are staggering return of their year groups. Our advice to parents is to contact their child's school direct to confirm their local arrangements. It is possible this will change again, and I will get information to you as soon as I have it. Remember we have loan laptops available for children if needed.

* In some local areas, under the contingency framework students will have remote education except for exam years and vulnerable and critical worker children. Special schools for primary years should continue to allow pupils to attend full time.
