COVID Email Update 29 March 2021 (dyslexia friendly version)


Good morning to you all, I hope you and your families are all doing okay.

Another milestone in the COVID journey starts today, as 6 people or 2 households can meet outdoors, including in private gardens. Community centres are beginning to re-open gradually and outdoor sports facilities will reopen from today. As the weather continues to improve, this should offer you more choice of alternative venues to meet families if they would prefer to meet outside their home. It's still so important that we're vigilant in our face-to-face work with families, and that we complete the pre-visit checklist before every face-to-face meeting and follow our social distancing guidance. This continues to help keep us and families as safe as possible. Updates for you this week:

Easter Holidays Free Activities and Food Programmes for Camden Children – Booking Now Open

The Easter programme of free activities and food programmes for Camden children is now open. More information on the Guidebook here https://ascpractice.camden.gov.uk/early-help-guide/family-early-help-covid-guidebook/childrens-activities-and-home-learning/holiday-activities-things-to-do/#main. To qualify for the free offer, children need to attend a Camden school, be eligible for free school meals and have a letter confirming this from their school (schools are distributing the letters this week). Given our usual early help play spaces are still limited due to social distancing restrictions, this might be a really good alternative for families. Please do share this link with families and book quick as places are limited.

We also understand that in addition to this programme, £15 supermarket vouchers will also be sent to families in receipt of benefits. This will be sent direct from the Council's Benefits Team.

Children's A&E departments reopening in April

Last year, temporary changes were made to paediatric services in north central London (NCL). NCL NHS have now agreed it is safe to reopen the children and young people's accident and emergency departments and general inpatient wards at University College Hospital from 9am on Thursday 8 April and at the Royal Free Hospital from 9am on Monday 12 April. Until the UCH and the Royal Free Hospital sites reopen, children and young people should continue to access emergency care through alternative hospitals. Many of you are currently working with families who are living in one of the Home Office COVID initial accommodation centres in Camden. These centres were set up by the Home Office during COVID to provide accommodation for families seeking asylum

during the 'everyone in' period. I am now meeting every three weeks with the Home Office and their subcontractor called Clearsprings who run the accommodation. If families experience any problems of any kind in the centres which you can't resolve, or if anything gives you cause for concern at the centres, please do let me know so I can take it up direct with the Home Office.

Scam and Malicious Emails Regarding School COVID Testing

We have received information from Camden Learning that a scam/malicious email about testing and mask-wearing in schools has been doing the rounds. A few Camden primary schools have reported receiving an anonymous email appearing to be from 'a group of parents at your school'. The email expresses strong views on school COVID testing and mask wearing. The email is branded 'CLC Justice'.

If parents experience this, the advice from Camden learning is not to forward the email or click on any links in it. Parents can report scam or malicious emails to report@phishing.gov.uk by attaching the email pasted into a Word document with a short explanation.
