

## COVID Email Update 31 May 2021 (dyslexia friendly version)

Good morning to you all, I hope you and your families are all doing okay. I am sending this a couple of days early as I am on leave this week until Friday.



In April, I promised to share with you all the results of our staff survey looking at levels of confidence in being culturally responsive in our work and feelings of safety in talking about racism and discrimination. The results of the survey are attached. Managers met to explore and reflect on the findings last Wednesday, and they will be carrying this through into your team spaces in the coming weeks.

This survey is vital for our racial justice and equity work. It gives us a benchmark that we can repeat again in 12 months time to see if our goals helped increase levels of confidence and feelings of safety, But more importantly, it shines more light on your daily lived experience of working in and for Camden. As I said in my Black Lives Matter update on 12 April, there are undoubtedly strengths for us to build on. But there are also specific needs that we must work on at pace, particularly in supervisory and partnership spaces.

The next step is to incorporate the survey findings into our service goals. The Racial Justice and Equity Organising Committee will turn the goals into plans at their first meeting on 16 June, and then work with service managers to drive change forward. I repeat my commitment to you that I will actively challenge racism, inequity and its structural causes, and contribute to social change for a more just, humane, equitable and peaceful world. Whilst it is our collective responsibility to work together to achieve change, I have a responsibility and a duty of care to make sure you and the families we help feel safe, valued, listened to and treated with dignity and respect. Keep holding me accountable as I hold myself accountable.

The Government's temporary ban on eviction of tenants during COVID ended on Monday 31 May. We've known this was coming for a while and it will particularly affect families in private rented sector accommodation. One final thing to share with you this week is a Diversity Welcome (attached), which I used for the first time last week at our Extended  SMT meeting. Diversity welcomes can help to give a clear statement of intent that everyone is welcome and that we reject discrimination, racism, oppression and inequality. The welcome can also help us if we hear or see racism or discrimination, by enabling us to ‘call back’ to the welcome and ‘call in’ the behaviour.

The format was shared at a justice and social change training course I attended. I’ll be using this diversity welcome at the start of webinars and training that I deliver from now on.
