A short update for you this week:

Events in Afghanistan

We have all been rocked by the humanitarian crisis happening in Afghanistan over the last week. If you have friends or family connections in Afghanistan, we are here to give you whatever support you need – please do reach out, we will do all we can to help. Camden is already home to a number of children and families from Afghanistan, including some of the residents in the Home Office contingency hotels in the borough. It is an incredibly worrying time for these families, and as ever we will do all we can to hold, help and support them.

We now know that the Home Office will be launching an Afghan Citizens Resettlement Scheme and our Council Leader Georgia Gould issued a statement earlier today confirming Camden's commitment to support refugees from the crisis – you can read it here https://news.camden.gov.uk/camden-ready-to-welcome-refugees-from-afghanistan/. There is a Home Office helpline for British and non-British nationals needing to leave the region, and you can find details here https://www.gov.uk/guidance/support-for-british-and-non-british-nationals-in-afghanistan/. Camden's communities are already mobilising to give as much support as possible to Afghan refugees who arrive in the borough.

There is still a huge amount we don't know, but I will make sure I let you have details as soon as I get them. If you are working with a family who has been affected by this crisis, or who needs help for family still in Afghanistan, please do contact me and I will do all I can to help.

Individual Risk Assessments

In my last weekly bulletin I mentioned that Health and Safety have updated the COVID individual risk assessment. We will now begin to transfer from the old template to the new one. I have asked your managers to discuss and complete the new individual risk assessment template with you at your next supervision. We aim to get all FSCF staff transferred to the new individual risk assessment template by 30 September latest.
