#### 1. Introduction

The refreshed national <u>Supporting Families Programme</u> (previously Troubled Families) has now been launched. This document provides an overview of the framework, step-by-step guidance for recording information in MOSAIC

### 2. Supporting Families programme overview

The <u>Supporting Families programme</u> aims to help vulnerable families and drive system change in local services and to build resilience, prevent escalation into statutory services and create joined up local services that can better identify and support families in need.

#### 3. How to record information in MOSAIC


Supporting Families information is recorded in **Section 5.** of the **Child and family assessment** and Section 4. of the <u>Final</u> 'Child or young person in need plan workflow steps.

It's important to note that any headline issues selected must be evidenced within the 'Child and family assessment' plan and any selected progress measures are evidenced within the final 'Child or young person in need plan' record.

Figure 2. Associating indicators of need to child(ren)








Figure 3. Indicators of need associated to single and multiple children. Example shows one child with 1.1 Less than 90% attendance, a sibling with 1.2 Less than 50% attendance and both children with 1.3 Not able to participate and engage with education.




## Child or Young Person in need Plan recording progress

Family need indicators selected in the Child and family assessment will copy over into the Child or young person in need plan.


<u>Additional</u> family need indicators can be added at this stage if any others were identified during the social work intervention.







<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> Please ensure the *progress measure ID* selected corresponds to the *indicator ID* i.e., indicator 1.1 must have a 1.1 progress measure, 2.2 indicator must have a 2.2 progress measure etc. (see example *Figure 5*)
